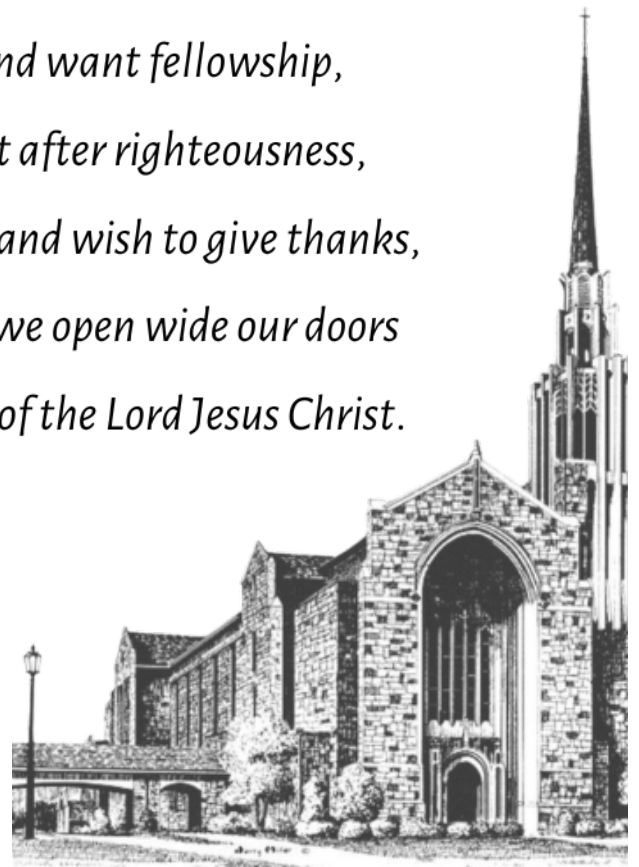

SERMON REFLECTION QUESTIONS: HEBREWS 2:14-18

1. Today's Scripture passage delves into the significance of the Incarnation—that Jesus is both fully human and fully divine. When we profess that Jesus is fully human, we are reminded that He understands and has experienced all that we experience—the joys, the sufferings, the temptations, and everything in between. How does the truth of a God who understands our day-to-day struggles give us a sense of comfort and strength?

2. Jesus is also fully divine. As today's verses proclaim, Christ defeated death and evil and “became a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people.” How does the truth of a God who overcomes the world give us a sense of hope and peace?

3. Our sermon series this month is “Go and Tell.” As you think about your everyday responsibilities, interactions, and relationships, how can you witness to the Good News of the Incarnation this week?
