

Reflection Questions: John 2:1-11

- 1. Today's Scripture passage recounts the first public miracle of Jesus' ministry in the Gospel of John. The focus of miracles is not on the acts themselves but rather what they reveal about Christ. What does the miracle of changing water into wine reveal about Jesus? Why do you think this was the first public miracle recounted in the Gospel of John?
- 2. Pastors Jeff and Clark preached about the ways that this miracle reflects the abundant life we have in Christ. As you consider your own faith journey, in what ways have you experienced abundant life in Christ? In a world that often focuses on scarcity and discontentment, how do you stay anchored in living abundantly in Christ?
- 3. Our Scripture passages for this sermon series invite us to "Come and See" the Good News of Jesus Christ so that we can "Go and Tell" this news to the world around us. This week, how can you share the good news of our abundant life in Christ with those around you in word and/or deed?

The Wesley 100 is now offering new Wesley Memorial ball caps for sale! The cost is \$20.00 per cap. The first group of hats is expected to arrive by




