

The organization has grown from a High Point based organization to 5 different state and 10 different cities with over 100 partners and sponsorships. Wesley Memorial will conduct a blanket drive the first two Sundays in November. Boxes will be placed at each worship location where you may bring your gently used or new blankets, comforters, or throws of any size. A Cleaner World will clean and pack the blankets for distribution. After the drive Wesley Memorial will match you donations so your one becomes two! When you snuggle in your warm bed just imagine what it would be like to sleep outside with no blanket or to sleep in a shelter with no warm cover. Blankets are also given to Law Enforcement to be given to those in need.
