




The menu for January 17th is BBQ, coleslaw, and baked beans. All dinners come with salad bar, roll, and dessert.




#### **School of Methodism**



#### From Pastor Ken and Lydia

Dear Wesley Memorial Family,

Recently in the bulletin and via the Wesley Weekly, Pastors Jeff and Clark shared their decisions and reasons regarding having their ministerial credentials recognized and affirmed in this new chapter of ministry as an autonomous Methodist church.



Lydia and I have chosen Wesley Memorial to be our spiritual community and family. We believe God has called us to join you in faithful ministry and life together.

The reality is that the UMC has in place, and rightly so, rules for UMC clergy that also apply to those in retirement. One of those rules is that a UMC clergy may not serve a non-UMC church without the approval of the Bishop. In addition, a UMC clergy, even retired, must have their charge conference membership at a UMC church and they are expected to participate in ministries there.

Since we are now an autonomous Methodist Church my options were to give up my clergy credentials or to leave my Wesley Memorial family and go to a UMC congregation. It has been a very intense season of prayer and reflection as Lydia and I have wrestled with discerning God's faithful path for us. We have come to a place of peace. As of December 31, I have withdrawn from conference membership in the Western North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church. My ordination and clergy credentials have been recognized by the Global Methodist Church.

Wesley Memorial is an autonomous congregation. The recognition of my credentials by the GMC in no way obligates Wesley Memorial financially or in any other ways to the Global Methodist Church. Wesley Memorial will make its own decisions about denomination affiliation or remaining autonomous overtime. This recognition of clergy credentials allows me to continue serving you as one of your pastors and provides accountability that I believe all of us clergy need. Lydia and I thank you for being our spiritual family and for the gift of serving with you. As we continue the journey together my fervent prayer is that we will continue to grow in our care and connection for each other and our unity of purpose in connecting people to Jesus, one another, and the world.
