# Financial Status for Western North Carolina Program and Missions Program

The members of Wesley Memorial have contributed approximately \$93,000.00 as of March 1, 2025! We will continue to provide funding for our neighbors in the mountains of North Carolina as long as our resources allow. Please know that your mission team is keeping its finger on the pulse of the needs in Western North Carolina. Ken Gulledge and Joe Lorber are in communications with our contacts multiple times a week in determining how we can support our neighbors.

The most pressing need now is counseling for mental health. How would you feel if you lost everything or almost everything? You survived the Hurricane but your home and property did not, or, perhaps, you lost a family member or friend. You still have monthly payments on items that were either damaged or destroyed. Samaritan's purse is coming in and helping rebuild or repair 500 traditional homes and 500 mobile homes. This is why we are continuing to support Samaritan's Purse. We have also provided heating fuel for the past several months and will continue through May. We will be partnering with Seaboard Lion's Club with a hands-on event over the Easter weekend in Newland. Please continue to pray for these people for they are just like us in their desire to help themselves but they need a helping hand. Personally, having spoken to people with Samaritan's Purse they said, "The quality of our work is the platform of our witness," by Franklin Graham. Their theme is, "Ordinary people doing extraordinary things inspired by an awesome God." We at Wesley Memorial are doing just that! With your help, we will bring comfort and hope to these children of God through our financial, spiritual and personal support.

### A Family That You Helped In The Mountains

One of the newer projects we've been involved with is helping a first responder, his wife, and their two young children rebuild their home after devastating flood damage. Brandy Boone, our dedicated local contact, brought their situation to our attention.

Floodwaters filled their home, rising halfway up the walls. They had to evacuate, salvaging what they could. As soon as it was safe, they removed the water-damaged sheetrock to prevent mildew. From there, it was time to rebuild. After an on-site visit by Ken Gulledge, we knew we had to help.


Thanks to your support, we were able to provide funding for replacement sheetrock, a full bathroom renovation, new flooring, vanities, kitchen appliances, counter-tops, and other essentials—including the labor needed to get it all done.

And now, we have wonderful news: as of March 14th, the family has moved back into their home!

Brandy shared this heartfelt message to all of you:

"We cannot express how thankful we are and how blessed we are to see the family in THEIR home."

### Western North Carolina Partners

### **Wesley Memorial Congregation**

An incredible group of unbelievable, caring, generous, Christ like people who have provided funds and encouragement to be of assistance to people who were and are still in need.

#### Blue Ridge Propane, Newland, NC

Located in the Newland area, they maintain a fund for home delivery and refilling of larger propane tanks. All of the recipients have had their homes destroyed or made mostly unlivable due to Helene. These folks have been customers for a long time and are known to the organization to be in need.

### 3 Nails Hardware, Newland, NC

Located in the heart of Newland, they maintain a fund which we contribute to that pays for refills of 30 and 50 pound propane cylinders.

### Brandy Boone, Elk Park, NC

Brandy is the Mayor of Elk Park's wife and prior to the storm operated an animal rescue center. As a result of her involvement with animals she became a rescue point for many of the residents of the area by arranging services, providing food and necessities as well as a caring touch. She has been our partner and has directed us to local needs where we can make a difference.

#### Samaritans Purse, Boon, NC

One of the nation's premier response organizations who has had a presence in the area as soon as the storm lifted. They provided meals, emergency services, shelter and other relief services. Currently, they are preparing to build over 500 homes in the devastated area along with 500 mobile homes.

### All Souls Counseling Service, Asheville, NC

A counseling organization based in Asheville who recently received a governmental grant to provide needed mental health counseling services to victims on a sliding scale based on income. We are in conversations with them to provide on-site counseling in Newland

### Weaverville UMC, Weaverville, NC

Our first contact with anyone in the area after the flood was a member of this church. She coached us with what we should try to provide and what to forget - at least until later. As soon as the weather began to turn cold she began to tell us about propane. This church acted as a relief center for many weeks.

#### Seaboard Lions Club

A group from Eastern North Carolina who prepared and delivered over 5,000 thanksgiving meals. It started out with a goal of 200 but quickly escalated. This year we are planning on joining them to help with the meals (not as many) and support other activities.
