
Easter Flower Delivery



The members of Wesley Memorial have contributed an incredible \$93,000.00 to support our neighbors in the mountains of North Carolina! This number reflects monies collected from October 1st, 2024, through March 1, 2025. Your kindness and generosity are making a real difference, and we are committed to continuing this mission as long as our resources allow. Please know that your mission team is keeping its finger on the pulse of the needs in Western North Carolina. Ken Gulledge and Joe Lorber are in communication with our contacts multiple times a week in determining how we can support our neighbors. The most pressing need now is counseling for mental health. How would you feel if you lost everything or almost everything? You survived the Hurricane, but your home, property and the lives of neighbors and friends did not. You still have monthly payments on these items, but they were either damaged or destroyed. Samaritan's purse is coming in and helping rebuild or repair 500 traditional homes and 500 mobile homes. This is why we are continuing to support Sanitarian's Purse. We have also provided heating fuel for people for the past several months and will continue through May. We're also excited to partner with Seaboard Lion's club for a hands-on mission event over the Easter weekend in Newland and this event is open to everyone. Please continue to pray for these people for they are just like us in their desire to help themselves, but they need a helping hand. As someone from Samaritan's Purse recently shared, "The quality of our work is the platform of our witness." Their mission is simple but powerful: "Ordinary people doing extraordinary things inspired by an awesome God." We at Wesley Memorial are doing just that! With your continued support, we can bring comfort and hope to these children of God through our financial, spiritual and personal support.
