

NICENE CREED

Lift up your hearts.


We lift them up to the Lord.

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise


and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

(If you need to be served at your seat, please tell an usher.) If you are gluten intolerant, we offer a gluten-free wafer. You may receive the wafer from the server between the communion stations. If you are not gluten-intolerant, we ask you to please receive the bread.


