


THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ. When you gave him to save us from our sin, your Spirit led him into the wilderness, where he fasted forty days and forty nights to prepare for his ministry. When he suffered and died on a cross for our sin, you raised him to life, presented him alive to the apostles during forty days, and exalted him at your right hand. By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you have given birth to your Church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit. Now, when we your people prepare for the yearly feast of Easter, you lead us to repentance for sin and the cleansing of our hearts, that during these forty days of Lent we may be gifted and graced to reaffirm the covenant you made with us through Christ.

On the night in which he gave himself up for us, he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." When the supper was over he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood.

By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory, and we feast at his heavenly banquet. Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty Father, now and forever.



SHARING THE EUCHARIST

Mission Moment

The High Point Jail Ministry offers faith-based programs to men and women incarcerated at the Guilford County Detention Center here in High Point. Prior to suspending all volunteer activities during the Covid outbreak, this active ministry offered 3-4 daily programs on each of five floors, six days a week. A large number of churches and other religious organizations provided the volunteers for these programs offering Christian and Islam instruction, as well as secular programs such as GED and other "life skills" training. Wesley Memorial has manned a team of volunteers since 2005 offering Bible studies. Gratefully, after a three-year hiatus due to Covid, volunteer programs will be commencing once again this Spring. Our Wesley Memorial team will participate and is looking to add new members to this effort. No special training is required, just a willingness to share your faith with men and women who are hungry for that transformative message. As you are being a blessing, you will also be blessed. Our Jail Ministry is also closely tied with Wesley's Angel Tree outreach which serves the children of incarcerated parents.
