

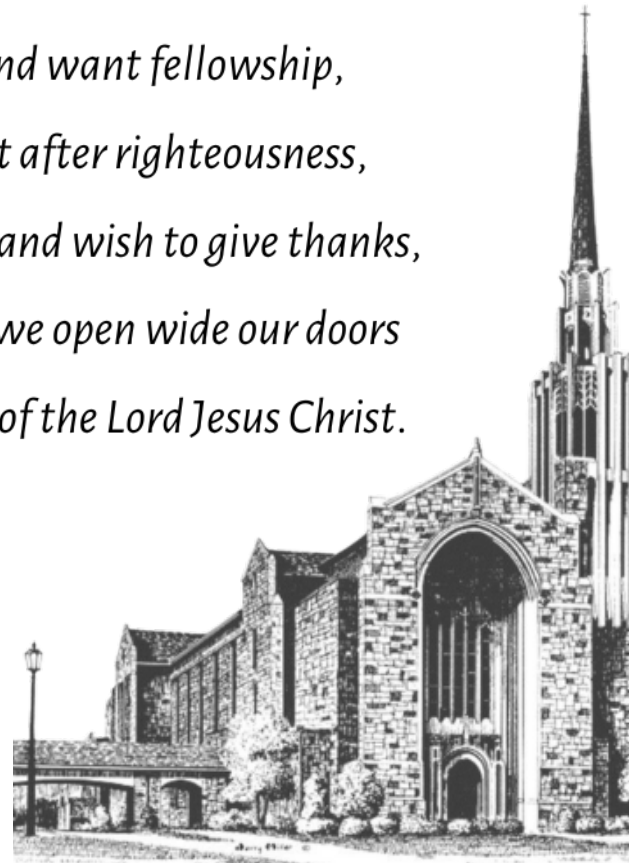

REFLECTION QUESTIONS: JAMES 2:1-17

1. Although we are saved by grace through faith, James reminds us in today's passage that our faith should be reflected in our works. Take a moment to reflect upon your day-to-day living, especially over this past week. In what ways did your faith impact your daily actions?

2. James warns us against showing partiality in how we treat others. In our world, it is easy to make judgments of one another and to love only those whom we like or with whom we agree. How does faith help you overcome the temptation to show partiality? Why do you think the virtue of showing no partiality is so essential to the Christian witness?

3. Take time this week to consider your relationships with others. What specific ways can you engage in acts of service and kindness, particularly in relating with someone with whom you may disagree or find difficult to love?

Workbooks will be available at the receptionist's desk prior to the first session (some reading is required for the first lesson). The workbook cost \$45, but there are scholarships available. Disciple Bible study at Wesley will head down an exciting new path in the coming year. This year's group will dive into the Disciple 2 Study called "Into the Word, Into the World." The 30-week study takes a deep look at the books of Genesis and Exodus during the first half of the year. In our "second semester" we'll tackle Luke and Acts. The weekly classes feature video presentations, lively lectures, and great group discussions. Individual faith is deepened, and new bonds are formed. This is a follow-on study for the Disciple 1 course, but there is no prerequisite. The course is open to any prospective disciple, regardless of whether they've been through Disciple I or not. Disciple Bible study does require a commitment -- several hours of individual reading and study each week along with the two-hour class -- but any Disciple who has completed a class will tell you that it is well worth the time.
