



#### **Disciple Bible Study**

Disciple Bible Study at Wesley continues with a new class, Wednesday nights beginning Sept. 10. This year's study will follow the Disciple 3 curriculum, entitled "Remember Who You Are." It delves into the writings of the Old Testament prophets and the travails of the Israelite people during the monarchy days (first semester), and then offers a close study of the Letters of Paul (second semester).

Disciple is a 30-week study that involves preparatory reading in the Bible and in the Disciple handbook plus weekly classes of about 2 hours. The various Disciple courses -- there are six -- have reached millions world-wide, immersing them not only in a great Bible study, but an enriching spiritual experience as they study the Word in the company of fellow Christians. The relationships created are long lasting; the fellowship experiences unforgettable.

Tucker Mitchell is leading this year's class. It's his fourth Disciple class at Wesley and his 16th overall.

#### Monday Morning Bible Study with Pastor Jeff

God's Plan for the Jews: A Study of Romans 9–11 will be offered at Wesley Memorial Church on Mondays at 10:30 a.m. in the Media Center, beginning September 8 and continuing through December 8. The study will be led by Dr. Jeff Patterson.

This series will explore the vital question: now that Jesus Christ has come, what is God's plan for Israel? In Romans chapters 9 through 11, the Apostle Paul addresses this profound and often challenging topic, offering insight into God's sovereignty, His covenant promises, and His ongoing work with the Jewish people. Participants will engage deeply with Paul's teaching as they seek to understand God's redemptive plan and its significance for both Jews and Gentiles in the Christian faith.

#### Wednesday Fall Bible Studies with Pastor Jeff

A Study of First Corinthians will be offered at Wesley Memorial Church beginning September 17, 2025, and continuing through May 13, 2026. Participants may choose to attend the Wednesday morning session at 9:30 a.m. in the Dining Hall or the evening session at 6:45 p.m. in the Media Center. The study will be led by Dr. Jeff Patterson.

First Corinthians is a book filled with practical Christian truth. Paul founded the church in Corinth, but the believers there struggled to leave behind their old lives and embrace their new identities in Christ. Throughout the study, participants will explore a wide range of topics addressed in 1 Corinthians, including church divisions, sexual immorality, lawsuits among believers, marriage, worship practices, women's role in the Christian community, the work of the Holy Spirit and spiritual gifts, Holy Communion, and the resurrection of the body. This study offers an opportunity to dive deeply into the timeless wisdom and guidance found in Paul's letter to the Corinthians.
